God's Character

"your name"

ESV

- Jn 17:6

 "I have manifested <u>your name</u> to the people whom you gave me out of the world. Yours they were, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word.
- Jn 17:11 And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one.
- Jn 17:12 While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled.
- Jn 17:26 I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."





John 14:13-14 (ESV)

¹³ Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ If you ask me anything in my name, I will do it.

To ask in Jesus' "name" does not mean to tack such an expression on the end of a prayer as a mere formula.

Jesus lived in the will of the Father, and the Christian is duty bound to live in the will of Jesus. Appropriate praying/asking here, therefore, must follow the same model Jesus exemplified. Mere reciting of the name of Jesus must not be understood as a mantra of magical power that provides the petitioner with his heart's desire. A "name" in the Semitic context carries a special sense of **the nature** of the name bearer.

"Name" =

To "praise" or "bless" the name of Yahweh means more than to verbally pronounce blessing or praise. There is a real sense in which for Israel to live in ways that are **consistent with the character of Yahweh** is to live up to his name and thus to bless and praise it.

To "put" Yahweh's name on Israel is to claim them as his special possession under his sovereign authority and care, and it **defines** their **character** henceforth in relation to him alone.

To "pray in Jesus' name" means:

- "(1) to identify the content and motivations of prayers with all that Jesus is and
- (2) to pray with full confidence in Him as He has revealed Himself." This is because a "name" in the biblical world represented the **character** and quality of the person or thing named.
