Scripture: Mark 14:1-9

Mark 14:1-9 (ESV)

It was now two days before the *Passover* and *the Feast of Unleavened Bread*.

And the chief priests and the scribes were seeking how to arrest JESUS by stealth and kill him,

2 for they said, "Not during the feast, lest there be an uproar from the people."

3 And while he was at **Bethany** in the house of Simon the leper, as he was reclining at table,

<u>a woman</u> came with an <u>alabaster</u> flask of ointment of pure <u>nard</u>, very **COSTLY**, and

she **broke** the flask and **poured** it over his head.

4 There were some who said to themselves indignantly,

"Why was the ointment **wasted** like that? **5** For this ointment could have been sold for more than <u>three hundred denarii</u> and given to the poor." And they scolded her.

6 But Jesus said, "Leave her alone. Why do you trouble her?

## She has done a **beautiful** thing to me.

**7** For you always have the poor with you, and whenever you want, you can do good for them.

But you will not always have me.

8 She has done what she could;

she has anointed my body beforehand for burial.

9 And truly, I say to you, wherever the Gospel is proclaimed in the whole world,


what she has done will be told in memory of her."




- Where is the small township of Bethany located (Northern or Southern Israel)?

What are some of the reasons that make this woman's act of anointing Jesus beautiful?

What is something beautiful that you could do for Jesus?

Extravagant love leads to extravagant giving. What well-known Bible verse communicates this truth in a nutshell?

The Gospel comes as a result of God giving. We receive the Good News of Jesus' victory over sin and death, resulting in the forgiveness of our sins, a new birth into eternal life, and the promise of the Kingdom Come. God so loved the world that He gave us everything. How does this impact your heart? What does it motivate you to do?
