Sometimes it serves best to go back to the basics. So today, we go back to the core elements of Christianity - the Good News of Jesus' Victory.

- What does the Bible tell us is of "First Importance?"
 - 1 Corinthians 15:1-8 (ESV)

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the Gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, ² and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you–unless you believed in vain.

³ For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶ Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷ Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. ⁸ Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me.

il think for something to be consider the Gospel it must include the concepts of **Sin**, **Substitution**, and **Faith**.

The Good News is:

We all have sinned and can not approach a Holy God (*sin*). But God, in His great love for us, sent His Son Jesus to die on the Cross to pay the penalty for all of our sins (*substitution*). Therefore, by believing in - or trusting in Jesus as your Savior, you can have eternal forgiveness of your sins (*faith*).

- εὐαγγελίζομαι "I Evangelize You" = I bring you good news.
- The Angel evangelized the Shepherds... (Luke 2:10)
- iv Ephesians 4:7-16 (ESV)
 - ⁷But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. ⁸Therefore it says,

"When he ascended on high he led a host of captives,

and he gave gifts to men."

⁹(In saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower regions, the earth? ¹⁰ He who descended is the one who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.) ¹¹ And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, ¹² to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³ until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, ¹⁴ so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. ¹⁵ Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

1. Sin

Romans 3:23 (NIV)

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

Isaiah 59:2 (NIV)

But your iniquities have <u>separated</u> you <u>from</u> your <u>God</u>; your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he will not hear

2. Substitution

Romans 5:8 (NIV)

But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died \underline{for} us.

3. Faith

John 3:16-18

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. ¹⁸ Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son. (NIV)

Jesus said, "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹ My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. ³⁰ I and the Father are one."

Romans 8:39 (NIV)
